

Alderman Fenwick's House, Pilgrim St, Newcastle

This landmark Grade I and Grade II listed 17th Century merchant's house is believed to be one of the oldest surviving private houses in central Newcastle.

Rescued from a ruin and brought back in to use by the Trust in 1997 following a 15 year restoration, we manage the building as a business centre for SME's. Currently held on a long lease, our ambition is to acquire the freehold from Newcastle City Council.
