

Bottle Kilns, Corbridge, Northumberland



Fired but not forgotten

After 41 years of hard work under the Trust's management, the bottle kilns – or hovels to give them their proper name – were officially removed from Historic England's Heritage at Risk Register.

Unusually elegant for industrial remnants, the kilns date from around 1840 and were part of the Walkers "Fire Brick and Sanitary Tube" Works, being used for the manufacture of bricks, tiles and chimney pots until the business's closure in 1910.

Today they are a Grade II* listed Scheduled Monument and are held by the Trust on a 99 year lease. We are working with strong support from the Corbridge Village Trust and the Corbridge Heritage Trust to secure a future for these much admired structures.
